

## BUCKS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

November 8, 2007

The Regular Meeting of the Bucks County Board of Commissioners was held on Thursday, November 8, 2007 at 10:00 a.m. at the Bucks County Courthouse, Community Room, Doylestown PA. In attendance were Commissioner Charles H. Martin, Chairman, Commissioner James F. Cawley and Commissioner Sandra A. Miller. Commissioner Martin opened the meeting with a moment of silence followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

### PROCLAMATIONS

The Commissioners proclaimed November 2007 as "ADOPTION AWARENESS MONTH" applauding the compassionate care provided by the staff of Bucks County for foster and adopted children and encouraging all Bucks Countians to consider helping a child in need by offering the opportunity to live in a permanent, loving home. Kelly Gahan-Taylor and Jennifer Stubing-Robos accepted on behalf of the agency. They expressed their appreciation to the Commissioners for their support and said they are looking forward to more adoptions this year.

### COMMENDATION

The Commissioners issued a Letter of Commendation to Bucks County Park Ranger, Dan Gol, in recognition of his recent act of bravery and heroism in assisting with the apprehension of an accused bank robber. They commended him for protecting the citizenry of Bucks County and applauded his commitment to public safety. Park Ranger Dan Gol accepted along with his family. He thanked the Commissioners and said he was glad that it all worked out and that the suspect was taken into custody without anyone getting hurt.

### PUBLIC COMMENT (Non-Agenda)

On behalf of Military Affairs Director, Dan Fraley, Penny Larrisey handed out information for Recovering American Soldiers. The handout suggested that we keep the Soldiers in mind when purchasing Christmas gifts and provided the address for Walter Reed Army Medical Center in Washington D.C.

## MISCELLANEOUS

Commissioner Miller offered her congratulations to Commissioners Martin and Cawley on the successful election as well as her congratulations to the row officers who were reelected.

On a more somber note, Commissioner Miller spoke about the passing of former Commissioner Lucille Trench who was her immediate predecessor. Commissioner Miller spoke of the privilege of knowing and working with Commissioner Trench and was proud to have known her. She informed the public of the calling hours and stated that the minutes should reflect the Commissioner's sorrow of this loss.

Commissioner Cawley added that although he did not have the opportunity to work with Commissioner Trench, he followed her career and commented that she was a strong, intelligent woman who was tenacious in the causes she believed in. Commissioner Martin echoed his statements that Commissioner Trench was someone who always had the best interests of the people of the County in mind in the decisions that she made as a member of the Board of Commissioners.

David M. Sanko, Chief Operating Officer, reported on the following matter(s):

Election – Mr. Sanko informed us that the election turnout was 26.2% and the process went well as far as the function of machines. He said other than a few minor issues (most of which were resolved over the phone) only one machine needed to be replaced during the course of the day and that was accomplished without causing interruption.

Open Space Referendum – Mr. Sanko was happy to report that the Open Space ballot referendum not only passed in every district but exceeded the passage of the 1997 referendum.

Restaurant Inspection Site – The online restaurant inspection site is up and running and lists over 100 County restaurants along with their inspection reports.

Justice Center Parking Garage – The final piece of our plan submission was made to the Doylestown Borough Planning Commission. We have gotten positive feedback from the professional staff of engineers who reviewed the plans and we look forward to taking the next step.

2008 Budget – Finance Director, Brian Hessenthaler, will be present the 2008 preliminary budget in two weeks.

PUBLIC COMMENT – GENERAL

Newtown Township Supervisor, Dick Weaver, congratulated the Commissioners on a great race. He wanted to pass on some comments received in Newtown Township regarding the voting machines. He said people liked the idea of the flashing lights as they prompt a voter to make a selection they may have otherwise missed. He also said that people have stated that they feel more confident in the new electronic machines.

Madeline Rawley, a Doylestown resident, said that she heard there were problems at polling places such as long lines and machines running out of paper and she asked to receive information regarding the election. She also spoke about the program involving high school students to assist at polling places and inquired as to how many teens worked the polls. She also offered to help assist with the organization of recruiting students for the next election.

Commissioner Miller agreed that staffing at polling places still remains a problem and encouraged Ms. Rawley to speak with Board of Elections Director, Deena Dean, regarding the recruiting of students as it would be a great experience for these young adults.

Connie Fewless requested that she be able to observe the tapes and cassettes from the Lower Bucks Service Center and the transmittal of election results to the courthouse.

Commissioner Miller responded that Judge Lawler presently serves as Chair of the Board of Elections but suggested Ms. Fewless submit her request to Deena Dean, a copy of which will be forwarded to David Sanko for response.

Solicitor Guy Matthews spoke regarding the time of receipt of Ms. Fewless' prior request and explained the amount of time that would be needed to accommodate it. Mr. Cawley asked for clarification on the time of receipt of her last request, which Ms. Fewless confirmed was sent the afternoon before Election Day (Monday) and they agreed that the Doylestown portion of her request was accommodated.

Upon motion of Mr. Cawley, seconded by Miss Miller, with the vote being 3-0, the meeting was adjourned.
