Welcome to the latest edition of Fresh From Bucks County Farms, our local directory of farmers who sell directly to you, the consumer. Each year, this popular guide lists places where you can find the freshest and best fruit, vegetables, meats and other farm products produced in Bucks County.

Bucks County has a rich agricultural history. At times we have been a major producer of processing tomatoes, fresh spinach, poultry and even asparagus. Those enterprises are gone. But now we have more than eight wineries, a half dozen flourishing community farmers markets...hundreds of us own shares in Community Supported Agriculture. Local agricultural production is still a significant part of our lives. A new generation of young farmers has emerged.

At least a dozen farms offer “Pick-Your-Own” (PYO) strawberries in June. 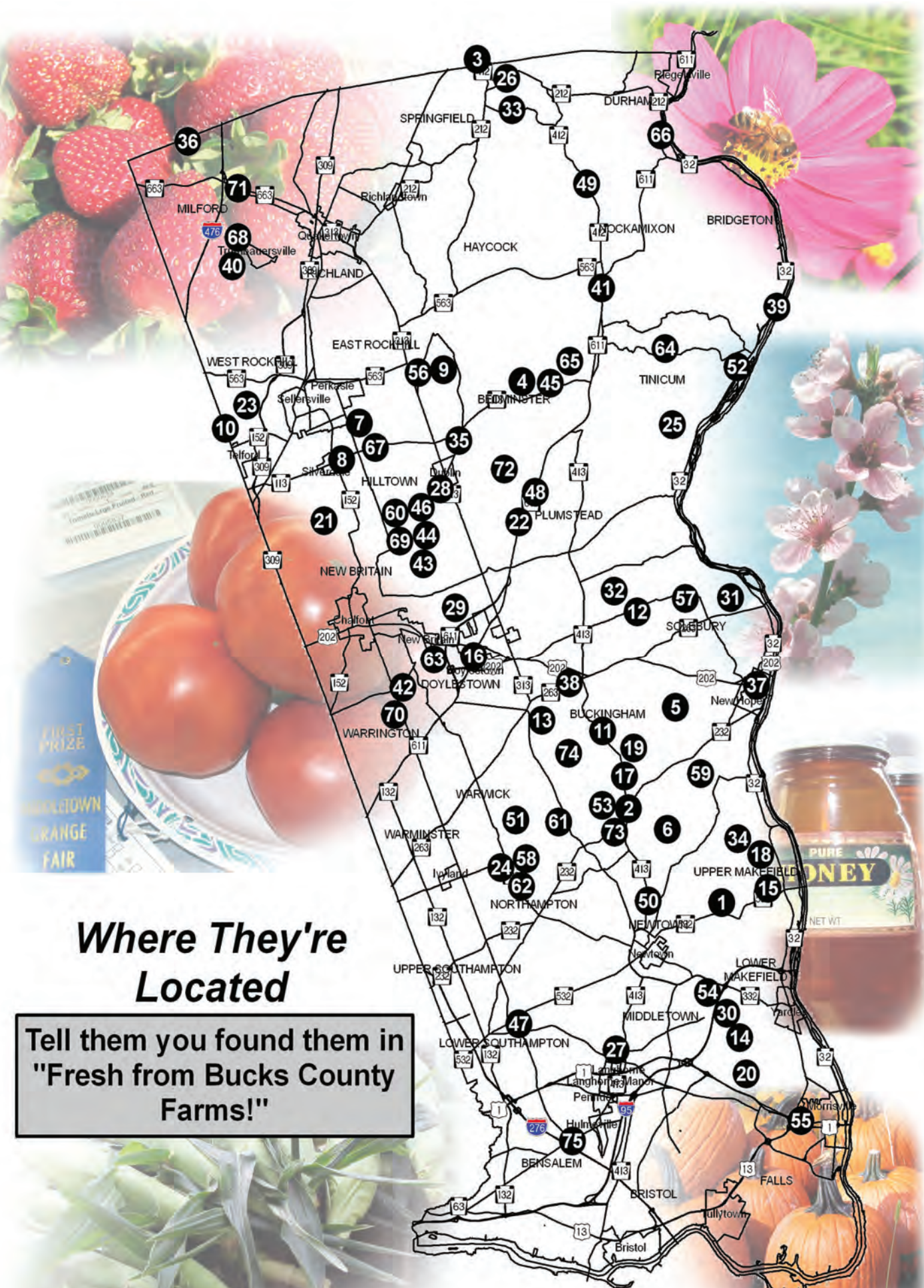

SUGGESTIONS FOR SHOPPING AT A FARM MARKET

Paying For Your Produce

Cash is the easiest as most markets do not take checks or credit or debit cards. However, did you know that many farm markets in Pennsylvania participate in a WIC (Women, Infants, and Children) Farm Market Nutrition Program? If your family qualifies, you can receive coupons good at farm markets that help supplement your meals.

Containers And Shopping Bags

Many farm markets have bags and boxes, but it may be easier if you bring your own bags with handles. Keep a few extra bags in your car for those unexpected shopping stops. If you are not returning home right away, have coolers with ice packs in your car. This will ensure your produce arrives home fresh and ready to eat.

Comfortable Clothes

Most markets are not in buildings and may only have an awning or canvas roof. If it is a large market and you plan on spending a lot of time shopping, be prepared with sunscreen and maybe an umbrella to keep off the sun or rain. Comfortable clothes and shoes will make your trip more pleasant. Markets are usually open rain or shine. If you take children along, make sure you have drinks for them. Children love to help pick out the fruits and vegetables and learning about fresh produce teaches them the importance of healthy eating habits.

Go Early—Go Late!

In the hot summer, morning can be the most pleasant time to shop. You'll find the best selection if you show up early too. But just before closing time, you may find some of the best deals even though the selection may be limited later in the day.

Take Your Time—Try Something New!

Have fun browsing and looking around. Don't be afraid to try something new. You may discover a new favorite fruit or vegetable. Shopping at a farm market means that you will get the best, freshest produce available.

Ask Questions

If you see something unfamiliar, don't hesitate to ask questions. Market vendors love to share their knowledge and can even give you recipes and cooking tips. The growers know their products, so if you have questions on preparation or storage, or just want to know how something is grown, ask away!



FARM MARKET NUTRITION PROGRAM (FMNP) FM NP

Purpose

The Farm Market Nutrition Program (FMNP) (WIC) provides resources in the form of fresh, nutritious, unprepared, locally grown fruits, vegetables, and herbs from farm markets in Pennsylvania. The purpose of FMNP is to provide fresh, unprepared, locally grown fruits and vegetables to WIC recipients, and to expand the awareness, use of and sales at farm markets.

Who Should Participate

The PA Department of Agriculture is responsible for authorizing individual farmers, farmers' markets, or both. Only farmers and/or farmers' markets authorized by the state agency may accept and redeem FMNP coupons. Individuals, who exclusively sell produce grown by someone else, such as wholesale distributors, cannot be authorized to participate in the FMNP.

WIC eligibility is determined by the local WIC Agency. It would include women that are pregnant, breastfeeding, postpartum and children ages two through five that qualify for the regular WIC program. Low-income seniors are the targeted recipients of the Senior Farm Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP) benefits.

How The Program Works

FMNP checks are distributed through the Area Agency on Aging (for seniors) and the WIC Agency (for WIC recipients). FMNP recipients are given a list of participating farmers and farmers' markets when they receive their checks. These checks are redeemed for fresh fruits and vegetables grown in Pennsylvania.

WHAT IS “ORGANIC”

Organic means different things to each of us—consumers and farmers. Most would agree that it means grown without synthetic fertilizers and pesticides. In agricultural production, the word organic gained greater significance when the United States Department of Agriculture defined the term and began to regulate just what could and could not be called organic. To use this term, growers must certify that they are following established guidelines.

For many small scale growers, the hassle of certification is just not worth the effort. Or perhaps some small part of their operation does not meet the standards established for USDA certification. Some of these growers may adopt another designation such as Certified Naturally Grown.

What’s a consumer to do? Talk to the folks where you buy your farm fresh food. Find out what their farming philosophy is all about. You might be surprised to find that the official organic designation, while useful in some settings such as the supermarket, is less meaningful than the conversation you have with the person who grew those tomatoes you are about to buy.

One of the beauties of buying from a local food producer is that you can look them in the eye; you can literally walk in the field where your food was produced; you can get to know the person who grew your food.

For many folks, local trumps organic. But that does not need to be the end of the conversation. Talk to your farm friends. Find out what they do and why they do it. Tell them what you think. Visit their farms and get a broad view how your food is produced. Then return to the word organic and see if it fits.

1 bushel	4 pecks / 32 quarts
1 peck	8 quarts / 16 pints
1 quart	2 pints
Flat (Usually measures 12 x 24 inches)	A full flat usually contains 12 pints and half flats contain six pints. 6 pints of berries will yield about 3 pints of jam.
